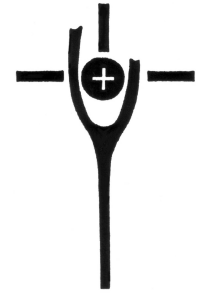

BETHEL AT FEED MY STARVING CHILDREN



On Saturday, January 9th, Bethel members traveled to Coon Rapids to a Feed My Starving Children packing site and packed meals. Feed My Starving Children provides a team-building environment where people of all ages can come together to pack nutritious, life-saving meals for starving children. These meals are then shipped to more than 60 countries around the world, truly offering hope to the hungry.



The group of 60+ in the 2-4 pm shift on 1/9/2010 filled 83 boxes (17,928 meals) which will feed 49 children 1 meal a day for an entire year! Bethel is arranging for future opportunities to serve at Feed My Starving Children in May and September! All monies that are donated to FMSC goes directly to food, packaging and shipping—ALL publicity is by word of mouth — us!! Check out the pictures on Bethel's website!

HAITI – WHY?

FROM PASTOR SEABAUGH

As I write this letter, the last few people are being pulled alive from the piles of stacked concrete on the island nation of Haiti. By the time you read this letter, relief efforts to assist millions of displaced people will be reaching the point of exhaustion. Why? It is the perennial question when a disaster of such a magnitude strikes. But it's also the question when our individual disasters strike, and even those disasters that nobody sees, hears or will ever remember. Why would God allow this to happen?

I don't know.

If I pretended to know the answer to that question, you would see right through me. I don't know. God knows, and He has only given us clues as to why these kinds of things happen. But why Haiti on January 12th at a magnitude of 7.0? I don't know. The clues point us to a perfect God and an imperfect creation. Sin has corrupted both mankind and this world, causing death and destruction for the rest of time until God restores it when Jesus returns. The first time Jesus came, he brought a way for restoration to happen within us as our sins are forgiven by God. The second time Jesus comes, this corrupted world will be made perfect again. Like I said, it doesn't explain Haiti, but it does give us a way to understand what's happening.

Not good enough.

For a lot of people the basic explanation I gave is not good enough. We heard televangelist Pat Robertson say the Haitian people are "cursed" because they "swore a pact with the devil" to get out from under French rule. So for him it's not good enough to say, "I don't know." Instead, he wants to speak for God when God has not spoken. That's risky business. Then you have the complete other side of the issue. There are people like the renowned atheist Richard Dawkins who find the entire Christian perspective not good enough. He writes on his Haiti relief site:

“Preachers and televangelists, mullahs and imams, often seem almost to gloat over natural disasters – presenting them as payback for human transgressions, or for ‘making a pact with the devil’. Earthquakes and tsunamis are caused not by ‘sin’ but by tectonic plate movements, and tectonic plates, like everything else in the physical world, are supremely indifferent to human affairs and sadly indifferent to human suffering. Those of us who understand this reality are sometimes accused of being indifferent to that suffering ourselves. Of course the very opposite is the truth: we do not hide behind the notion that earthly suffering will be rewarded in a heavenly paradise, nor do we expect a heavenly reward for our generosity: the understanding that this is the only life any of us have makes the need to alleviate suffering even more urgent.”

No gloating here.

I'm sorry if I disappoint Mr. Dawkins, but there's no gloating here. If anything, I feel somewhat responsible. As a part of the human race, I know that my sin contributes to the corruption of the world, which God justly punishes. As a sinful human, I did not help to improve the living conditions for the people of Haiti. I am ashamed that the catastrophe feels so distant and that my insignificant problems still occupy the majority of my prayers. So, if suffering and generosity were to punch me a ticket to heaven, then I'm left at the gate. Good thing God was so generous to send Jesus to suffer in my place. Good thing He gives faith and life and salvation. Good thing He is a forgiving and loving God... even if I don't always understand why.

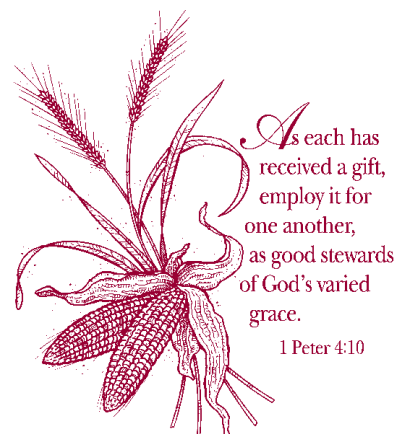

A STEWARDSHIP MOMENT



Stewardship is a spiritual issue. Some church members have come to dislike the word, “stewardship.” They repeatedly grumble about giving, squabble about how much, and complain about the church’s annual “Fall Stewardship Drive.” We’ve all heard the comments and experienced the anxiety of people during “budget” time. Who would have ever thought that “stewardship” would become one of their favorite words? What has changed?

They discovered the scriptural definition of “stewardship,” and its accompanying principles that have set them free, and helped them to experience life

differently. “Stewardship” is a scriptural word, describing the wise management of the goods that you have been given. Stewardship begins with a personal lifestyle. It is the wise management of your life. Freely and graciously, God has provided and entrusted you with an allotment of many goods of life to manage, spend, and multiply. Goods are everything good that you can point to in your life that God has graciously given to you. They include not only your resources and abilities, but also your salvation, relationships, creation, and much more. You are called to be a wise steward. Steward in the Biblical Greek literally means household manager. Stewardship is about building your house or building your life. From the Biblical Greek word for stewardship, we get our English word, economy. Stewardship is the wise economy of your life.

Today, people struggle and are challenged by how they will spend their time, resources, and even their lives. Minute by minute and day-by-day, life is unfolding while spending choices compete for their resources. Advertising, either through the media or other people’s lifestyles, bombards them with the message that having more will satisfy and then, not knowing any other option, they buy into this message. They are stretched by working long hours for a measure of prestige, or to attain a certain lifestyle while neither brings real and lasting contentment. They feel tired and worn out and stressed out a fair amount of the time by these choices, and yet, they do not know how to get off of the roller coaster of life they have chosen. Leave the roller coaster, open your heart and your mind and you could be saying:

- “I am a person blessed by God with resources beyond my imagination. As a life long Christian, I have been troubled with certain biblical perspectives summed up in the story that it is easier to get a camel through the eye of a needle than it is for a rich man to get into heaven. This has had a profound impact on my understanding of what God has given me, how I am to treat it and use it, and its place in my life and the kingdom of God.”

A STEWARDSHIP MOMENT — CONTINUED

• “God has blessed us with abundance. We try to be good stewards of our blessings and share what God has given us. We have a heartfelt desire to help others who may be struggling, help the church universal with its mission of reconciliation, and to share the Gospel through our God given talents for teaching. When we give, we receive great joy to see God’s good work being enabled through our gifts.”

As a result of God setting people free where they struggle, they naturally begin to give more to support the church’s needs and invest in God’s work without talking about budgets, pledges, and the church’s “stewardship” emphasis. They hear with open ears the principles of God’s economy at times other than the church’s annual budget emphasis and their increased giving reflects the joy of receiving God’s magnificent gifts.

Wise stewards learn the scriptural principles of God’s provision: wise management of life, need versus want, wealth (having more than you need), simplicity, contentment, Sabbath, investing in the kingdom, the protection of tithing, and the joy of giving, and sharing. This is in direct contrast with people who live their lives of personal ownership, possessing, wasteful spending, false definitions of need and wealth, overextension of time (“too busy”) and money (unwise debt), anxiety, greed, being driven, and being possessed by possessions. The Lord will provide for your need but not your greed.

We would like to remember two ex officio members of the Financial Stewardship Team who recently joined the church triumphant: Maureen Murray and Pastor Dick Goebel.

Maureen was always there for us, providing up to the minute financial numbers that aided us greatly in making decisions that needed to be made. Maureen crunched those numbers and always made sure the bills were paid in a timely manner. We will miss her financial expertise.

Pastor Goebel was a behind-the-scenes motivating force that helped keep us going through good times and not so good times. Dick knew the meaning of “Christian Stewardship” and was always available to share his substantial knowledge during planning for Fall Stewardship Drives and special fund raisers. He continually recommended reading material and web sites that would make us think about our duties and responsibilities as “Christian Stewards” and he shared extensively from his personal library. We will miss his wise counsel.

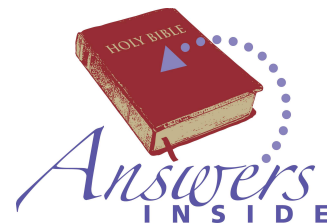

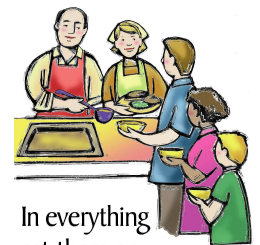
