Poverty and Our Response

Facts from UNICEF and International Labor Organization:

- Every day, nearly 27,000 children under age 5 die from preventable causes like dehydration, malaria and malnutrition.
- More than 400 million children have no access to safe drinking water.
- More than 100 million children worldwide are homeless.
- In developing countries, more than 93 million children of elementary school age don't attend school
- More than 200 million children ages 5-17 are engaged in child labor.

My Response: How can I make a difference? The facts are staggering and overwhelming. But there is something you can do to rescue children in need. Speak up!

Proverbs 31:8-9 says, “Speak up for those who cannot speak for themselves, for the rights of all who are destitute. Speak up and judge fairly; defend the rights of the poor and needy.”

The Bible contains more than 2,000 verses that instruct us to help those in need. In these verses we learn about God's heart for the poor. And we are given a clear mandate to speak up for those in need – straight from our heavenly Father. Please speak up for children in need, as God's Word instructs us to. Join us as we release children from poverty in Jesus' name.

It's interesting what you can do with one dollar still today. I found a \$1 car wash in Maplewood. For \$1 I can buy a Sunday paper. I can purchase interesting things at a dollar store. And yet these things pale in comparison to saving a child from poverty for only one dollar a day. Won't you consider speaking up for a child today? Hear how Bethel members are making a difference in the life of children around the world and you how can join them in lifting children from poverty.

FROM PASTOR SEABAUGH

HOLY**Holy Things**

The word “holy” means to set something apart for a special purpose, specifically for God’s purpose. We call the Bible the “Holy Bible” because of all the books in the world, this one is set apart by God as His word. We call the Lord’s Supper “Holy Communion” and baptism “Holy Baptism” because God has set apart these means to give us His grace and forgiveness. We call the church the “Holy Christian Church” because God has set us apart as His people by grace. Why all this talk about things that are holy? Because there are some “holy things” approaching and I want us to be ready to truly set them apart.

Holy Week

Of all 52 weeks of the year, we call this one “holy.” Why? What sets this week apart? This is the week the Holy Christian Church observes the final hours of Jesus life and his glorious resurrection three days later. So, we set this week apart for that purpose. We worship on a Thursday where we remember how Jesus set apart bread and wine as a means not only to remember Him, but to truly give us his grace. We worship on a Friday where we remember how Jesus suffered and died upon an instrument of torture, paying the penalty for all our sins. We worship on a Sunday morning unlike any other, where grim darkness is destroyed by the intense beams of life and light as our Lord is raised from the dead, destroying death forever for all who believe. Set apart this week with us and walk with Jesus through this Holy Week.

Holy Years?

I may be stretching it a little here, but I suggest we take the next two years and make them holy. Let me tell you what I’m thinking. We call the Bible “holy,” don’t we? We believe the whole thing is holy, not just the parts we read on Sunday. So, beginning in September, we will endeavor as a congregation to read through the entire Holy Bible in two years. How does this work? Let me tell you. From Monday through Saturday there will be a few chapters for you to read or listen to from the Bible. Then on Sunday, the worship and sermon will focus on that section of scripture that you read or listened to. In addition, we will encourage everyone to attend one of the many groups that will meet regularly to talk through the readings together. So set apart these two years to read God’s word! This will be a holy adventure for all of us!

Holy Motivation

Why should we read through the Bible together? As I look into our world and how it’s changed over the last 30 years, I see the need for the church to adjust to the times. I believe three things are necessary for the Christian Church at this time. **1) We must know what we believe. 2) We must know how to communicate what we believe. 3) We must build relationships that allow for that communication.** Reading through the Bible like this accomplishes all of those. You will have confidence in what we believe because you will be reading it for yourself (1). Then you will meet together with other Christians to talk about what you read (2&3). My hope and prayer is that as we grow in the Holy Word, and we engage in holy conversation, that we will allow that Holy Word to infuse into our everyday relationships and conversations so that others may know what it means to be called “holy” by Jesus, the one who died and lives to forgive all their sins.



A STEWARDSHIP MOMENT



In April we join with Christians around the world to celebrate Easter—the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the grave. The tomb is empty! Hallelujah! Jesus Christ is risen; He is risen indeed! On that first Easter morning, the “pain and stain” of death were forever wiped away. Jesus rose from the grave, never to taste death again, and by His resurrection opened up for us the doors to everlasting life. Let us rejoice and remember the words from a favored Easter hymn “Jesus Christ is ris’n today, Alleluia! Our triumphant holy day, Alleluia! Who did once upon the cross, Alleluia! Suffer to redeem our loss, Alleluia!” (Lutheran Service Book #457)

As St. Paul reminded us in Philippians 3, we not only have a citizenship in heaven, but we also have a citizenship in this world. As citizens of the world many people dread April 15th because it is the deadline for filing 2008 tax returns. Others may not be all that concerned because they had so much withholding tax that they will actually get a refund. Most Americans would be thrilled if they had to pay only 10% of their income for taxes. But we know better. In Minnesota the state sales tax on many items is 6.5 %. Social Security tax is another 7.65% (15.3% if you are a pastor, professional church worker, or others who are considered self-employed for tax purposes). State and federal income taxes are in addition to these other taxes. It doesn’t take long to figure out that we are paying “double and triple tithes” for state and federal taxes.

And how about tips when we go out to eat at a nice restaurant? 10% used to be the standard tip, but in most people’s minds it has moved up to 15-20%. We may grumble a little about this extra charge, but we pay it. What happens when Pastor Seabaugh preaches and teaches about a tithe (10% of income) for the support of the Lord’s work through Bethel Lutheran Church? Some people may view that as an impossible expectation. Others may view that as a good starting point and rejoice that they are able to move beyond the tithe because they want to respond generously from what God has graciously bestowed upon them.

Is giving a tithe of the financial blessings that God has given to us an impossible expectation? For most of us it probably isn’t if we practice discipline and good judgment in managing our financial resources. Some have learned to use the 10-10-80 plan. This plan involves giving the first 10% to the Lord, using the next 10% for saving and investing and then learning to live on the remaining 80%. It is not the perfect plan or the only plan, but it is a good one to start with if you find that you have not been disciplined in your handling of money.

Is giving a tithe a command for Christians? No, it isn’t, because to make the tithe into a command would make it more like taxes and tips. The big spiritual question about Christian giving is this one: “What percentage of the financial blessings that God has entrusted to me do I believe He is calling me to give?” We do not give in order to meet the church budget, or do our fair share or because someone puts a guilt trip on us. 2 Corinthians 9:7 gives us this wise counsel: “Each one should give what he has decided in his heart to

give, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful [literally, hilarious] giver.” The key is to talk to God in prayer, asking for His guidance regarding giving, and then moving forward empowered by His Holy Spirit to be free and joyful in our Christian giving.

A special “thanks” goes out to those of you who continue to support the Needy Fund, Food Shelf and the Dorothy Day Ministries. The need continues to increase due to the current economic turndown and your generous donations are greatly appreciated. As good stewards, we should use God’s gifts to serve and to help others. What a wonderful opportunity to serve our Lord and those who are less fortunate. Gracious Lord, may we be wise stewards of the gifts entrusted both individually and collectively to our congregation and give us the wisdom to effectively use these gifts from You to make a difference in our congregation.

Later this month you will receive a special mailing from the Financial Stewardship Team asking for your assistance in paying off our Lutheran Church Extension Fund line of credit in the amount of \$7,000 no later than June 1, 2009. Failure to do so will result in payment of increased interest on the unpaid balance and Bethel would be prohibited from using our line of credit in the event of an emergency. Your help is urgently needed!



Pass the hat and hammer down the debt

Our Leadership Team has reevaluated and prioritized our expenses, we are tightening our belt, and paying as we go. A revised budget has been wisely implemented to reflect the decreased revenue resulting from the economic slump. We have faith that we as a congregation will come through this financial turmoil and will be able to continue our mission to make disciples for Jesus Christ in our church, neighborhood and world. Today, as in the 1930s, difficult economic problems are best seen in the light of the biblical teachings, “Have faith in God” (Mark 11:22).

The tomb is empty! Hallelujah! Jesus Christ is risen; He is risen indeed! Have a blessed Easter!


