



OUR COMMON BOND

Common Bonds

Some of my most fond memories from my schooling have come from the relationships that were created. When I entered college and began my instruction in music, I was suddenly thrust into a community of students who had much in common. We all loved music and we talked about it all the time. Of course, we all had our specialties, voice, trumpet, piano, etc, but that didn't really divide us. We took the same classes together. We performed together. We hung out together. I still keep up with many of those relationships that were formed there, even though none of my classmates reside in this area. What keeps us close even though time and distance separate us? Music... our common bond.

What do we have in common?

I find a beautiful parallel between my college experience and what I expect the church to be like. We're all gathered here in the same place for the same reason, Jesus. Yes, we're young and old and working and retired and single and married and the like. But none of these things that could distinguish us compares to what binds us. We are Christian. We understand our need for forgiveness. We are sinners by birth and would be lost forever due to our disobedience to God. We have this in common! We know the grace of God through Jesus and his sacrificial death and the forgiveness that comes through faith in Him. We have this in common! As Christians we struggle with our sinfulness, all the while seeking to serve the God who has given us forgiveness and the confidence of life eternal. We have this in common!

Marriage Bonds

I wonder what would happen to a marriage if the couple spent their time talking about everything BUT what they have most in common. Would it be healthy? Would it thrive? Would it even survive? When I observe the Christian church, and even Bethel, I see us talking about everything BUT the things that we have most in common. Do we talk about spiritual things with each other? Do you talk about Jesus with your brothers and sisters at Bethel? Do you ever share your struggles with sin, the power of forgiveness, or the Spirit working through you to share the Gospel with others? Are we like the marriage relationship I described? Are we thriving in our relationships with each other? Imagine what would happen if we related on a spiritual level. Imagine the bonds that would be created, the faith strengthened, the Gospel shared...

Family Bonds

But I know the reality. We're not used to sharing things like that. Our faith is personal, private and sensitive. It's hard to reveal our struggles. It's hard to talk about faith. It's hard to know who to trust with our hearts. That's why we need to build the bonds of trust in our church family. We need to get to know each other on the personal level so that we can dig into the spiritual level together. I pray our GodSpeak groups will encourage us to share on the spiritual level. God will speak to you in His word. He wants to speak through you in your life. Your brothers and sisters in Christ understand that. God willing, we will build a culture in our church that encourages us to relate with each other by what we have MOST in common, Jesus.



LABOR DAY

In September we observe Labor Day, a legal holiday in honor of labor. The Bible deals with labor in a variety of ways. In Genesis 2:15 we read that “The Lord God took the man and put him into the Garden of Eden to work it and take care of it.” (NIV) It was part of God’s plan of creation to make human beings for work and provide work for them.

Work is important for us. It is important enough that we often answer questions like who or what we are by referring to our work. We may answer in a number of different ways like I’m a teacher, or a plumber, or a carpenter, or an office manager, or a business owner, or a pastor, or a doctor, or one of many other vocations. No wonder people get depressed when they are without jobs and meaningful work to do. Much of our self esteem is tied in closely with our work.

As God’s redeemed stewards we recognize that God has entrusted to us many things to manage and work with according to His will and plan. To not be willing to work and still expect to receive good things is like stealing. Ephesians 4:28 says, “He who has been stealing must steal no longer, but must work, doing something useful with his own hands, that he may have something to share with those in need.” (NIV)

Honest labor provides us with a sense of fulfillment and provides for our own needs and something extra to share with others who are in need. The giving of *time*, *talents* and *resources* provides many blessings and benefits. The total ministry of Bethel Lutheran Church is enhanced as Christian stewards use their *time* and *talents* for Sunday school, youth activities, church choirs, men’s and ladies’ groups, leadership and officer positions, and a host of other activities. In the process people are served and those involved in serving grow in their Christian discipleship. It’s a marvelous thing to see a church alive with members using their gifts and talents in a free and generous way. The Bible encourages us to find joy in our work.

Work is a blessing from God and He gives us the *time*, *talent* and *resources* to do our work in a way that honors God and blesses others as well as ourselves. If you have the *time* and *talent*, Bethel will provide the opportunity for you to derive great satisfaction from your work.

A STEWARDSHIP MOMENT — CONTINUED

Christian stewards are willing to take the first step and offer their *time, talents* and *resources* for service in our congregation. Wouldn't it be something if Pastor Seabaugh and Leadership Team had to tell the members to stop offering their gifts because more than enough had already been offered? One of the few times such a thing happened was during the gathering of freewill offerings for the building of the Old Testament tabernacle. Exodus 36:2-7 records that the people kept bringing gifts for building the tabernacle until there were way more than enough. Moses actually had to order the people to stop bringing more gifts for the project. What a pleasant problem!

The reality in most congregations is that there are fewer volunteers than needed, not more volunteers than needed. We believe the Spirit of God is at work here at Bethel and we will find people who are growing as stewards and looking for opportunities to use their *time, talents* and *resources* to make a difference building up the ministry at Bethel Lutheran Church.

During the summer months many members of Bethel were away on vacation. During your absence, the expenses continued for making disciples for Jesus Christ in our church, neighborhood and world. We want to both encourage and challenge you as a member of Bethel Lutheran Church to catch up on your tithes and offerings that were not given during the summer months while you were away. Let's remember that with the power of the Holy Spirit we can live and work as God's redeemed stewards who freely and joyfully manage all of life and life's resources for His purposes. May we always be encouraged to give our very best when it comes to our financial gifts of love, our use of time and talents, and our willing service at home, in the workplace, in our community and in our congregation.

From the parents: We very much like to see our children learning about Christ and the Bible every day at school.



The meeting was called to order by Rob Matthes. Devotions were led by Alan Bartelme.

The motion was made, seconded and carried to accept the minutes of the June 2009 mtg. The agenda was approved with additions.

Treasurer/Bookkeeper

Working on outstanding CLS balance-will schedule mtg with CLS about this; Worked with Wachovia, our investment broker, regarding a stock donation made to Bethel; Line of credit paid off & closed-will look into having an open line of credit available if needed; Will prepare and file property tax exemption requests w/Ramsey County in August (due every 3 years); Annual Budget Worksheet, Income/Expense Statement, & Balance Sheet reports distributed & discussed; 2 year LCEF notes with will mature November 30, 2009; Stewardship will discuss procedure to handle funds.

Pastor

Elders met this month & discussed the need and place for strategic planning in the congregation; Preparations for God-Speak underway—would like 85% of Bethel worshipers (approx. 110) to participate; Worship attendance average for June was 153; year-to-date: 166; African YTD: 24; Planning combined outdoor worship on August 23; picnic potluck to follow; Tuesday morning class continuing John study; will participate in GodSpeak. Revamping Confirmation curriculum for 2009-10; Plan to convene meeting of new Youth Ministry Board.

Currently working on application for funding for Fofana's ministry from MNS District; Planning is underway for next year's Financial Literacy Classes; weekly shut-in visits continue to be a great blessing; Encourage congregation to support for the Engen family as they battle leukemia with Brianna; LINC – Twin Cities - Rev. Jeff Cloeter has declined call to be the LINC church planter for the new Next Generation church in the Midway neighborhood.

Outreach

Completed 6 week DVD adult Bible study on "BRIDGES: Christians Connecting to Muslims."

Financial Stewardship

Gary working on fall stewardship campaign; dates for Stewardship Sunday & Commitment Sunday will be coordinated with Pastor; discussion of what to do with unrestricted donated funds-would like policy and group to make the decision; further details & discussion at August meeting; Suggestion made to use part of stock gift to pay CA commitment; agreement to use \$1,000 toward CA commitment of \$2,500.

S.O.S. delivered several hand knit baby blankets & sweater sets to Bundles of Love; Bethel members delivered week of meals to residents at Front Ave. High Rise through Meals on Wheels-openings available for additional volunteers; Dorothy Day - Bethel served 250 meals on June 28; Feed My Starving Children - will set up an event for Bethel members to volunteer in August or September; Presbyterian Homes staff interviewed Maureen & Caitlyn Murray about Meals on Wheels- will be included in Presbyterian Homes magazine.

Education

Met with Suzanne Norris regarding expectations & duties; Lynn Schibonski, Sunday School Superintendent, working on 2009-10 curriculum & teachers.

Old Business
