

**GODSPEAK VS. SPRING**

FROM PASTOR SEABAUGH

**The Title Match**

I can feel it coming... the great showdown between our effort to read the Bible together in two years and the lure of warmth in Minnesota. It's GodSpeak vs. Spring. I can hear the announcer in the center of the ring now. "In one corner we have the reigning champion, emerging from the freezer, a Minnesota native... Spring! (crowd cheers) And in the other corner, the ageless wonder, the powerful and inerrant... GodSpeak! (crowd cheers)" What makes it even more difficult is that over the next few weeks we'll be reading from 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> Chronicles... not the most engaging reading! So when I look to the odds-makers, it looks like Spring has the advantage in this match!

**Spring**

You can see why spring has such an advantage. There are beautiful reminders of resurrection everywhere. The trees budding out, plants popping out of the ground, lakes you can't walk on anymore... I could go on and on. I think God gives us spring as a wonderful reminder of how He provides for us each and every day, week after week, year after year. I also notice how moods seem to lighten in the spring. The warm weather and time outside just seems to brighten faces and put a spring back in our steps. So, yea, spring has a lot going for it.

**GodSpeak**

But then again, we did commit to read through the Bible in two years. That means for two springs we've said that we're going to be listening to God speak to us daily and allow those words to be spoken through us to other people. It just so happens that this spring we're reading 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> Chronicles. Amazingly, these Chronicles were written after the exiles returned from captivity in Babylon, so it was kind of like spring to them! They wrote to connect the people of God to their ancestors who walked the same land promised to them by God so long ago. As you read Chronicles, try to place yourself in the sandals of those who had returned from exile and wished to reconnect with the faith of their ancestors. Remember their stories, the lessons learned, and watch again as God works through history to be with His chosen people.

**A Draw**

Could it be that the title match between GodSpeak and Spring could end in a draw? I hope so. Here's one suggestion. Read your GodSpeak reading outside. Stop every once in a while to reflect on what you've read while you look at God's beautiful earth. Be reminded of resurrection and grace and mercy and then dive back in to the text for some more. Perhaps this isn't much of a competition at all. Maybe it's the beauty of Spring that will help you make the most of Chronicles! Maybe it's the review of God's work in Chronicles that will help you make the most of Spring! Regardless, let's keep up our readings and meeting with our groups. God has a lot more to say to you and through you... yes, even in spring!



## A STEWARDSHIP MOMENT

The pastor announced the final hymn, “Lift High the Cross,” Lutheran Service Book, number 837. Bobby found the hymn as the organist played the introductory verse. After the service, Bobby asked his mother, “What were those tiny notes at the end of each verse?”



Bobby had been taking piano lessons for two years now, and he often noticed things like that. “Those are called grace notes,” his mother replied. “They are notes that can be played as additions to the notes written.” “They are played to tie together the end of each verse to the beginning of the chorus to make the music flow better.” “Sometimes I think God writes grace notes into our lives to help us get to the chorus,” Bobby rightly observed.

Do you know what grace is? Almost no one uses the word grace in their daily vocabulary. Almost no one knows its meaning. It’s not a word we’re used to. God’s grace is: An undeserved gift from the King, given to one of His subjects out of the clear blue sky with no strings attached. First, and most important of all, it’s the gift of Jesus. Second, it’s everything God gives to you: air, water, food, shelter, possessions, spiritual gifts and talents, life. God gives it all to you because He loves you and delights in surprising you. Receive it gratefully. Manage it. At the time of the New Testament, that’s the way the Greeks understood the word, and that’s the definition brought into the Scripture from their common understanding.



God’s grace is invisible, yet it is everywhere. When you tune your car radio today think of the invisible radio waves it receives. An antenna pulls in the signals that fill the air. Like radio waves, God’s blessings (grace) are all around you—they saturate life. As a Christian, God’s Spirit dwells in you. The Spirit can be like an “antenna.” In connecting with the Spirit, you are able to “tune in” to God’s blessings (grace) in your life.

Let’s not forget the millions of people in the world who don’t know God’s grace. Please do your part to bring the Holy Spirit into their lives. Support mission work here at Bethel Lutheran Church.

Let the omnipresence of God’s love and care penetrate your heart and bring joy and delight to you today. With your spiritual eyes, receive and acknowledge His blessings.

## STEVE & JULIE LUTZ UPDATE—HOLY WEEK 2010

Dear Family and Friends,                    “Wait three days . . . . And see what God will do.”

Those are words of patience and trust. Delay the impetuous decision. Put a hold on worry. Wait, in faith. This “wait three days” is a phrase we missionaries in Papua New Guinea in years past would use to encourage one another. Then as now, times were unknown and often unsettled. The phrase, of course, flows in faith from Jesus’ death on Good Friday to God’s action in the glorious resurrection three days later. We don’t know the ending of any of our disappointments or setbacks -- other than that they come with a “spoiler’s alert”: God Wins, and because He has made us His own, there is no final Loss. Wait three days and see what God will do.

I mention this, for Steve and I are in a “wait three days” mode. We returned to the US in early March for a visit to Steve’s oncologist and Steve is proceeding with a second series of monthly chemotherapy cycles. And then two weeks ago, Steve’s physical condition slipped and he is currently moving around in a wheelchair. We are therefore in a “hold” pattern for our return to Papua New Guinea which had been scheduled for this week. We shall see what God will do.

Meanwhile, in PNG, our ministry team carries on. Paul Andrews and Anton Lutz are poised to move to Kaiam to work on the airstrip construction with the Penale people. We were able to get the new tractor and fuel flown to the site by helicopter. We pray the work will move smoothly.

Liz Neuf bid farewell to friends in PNG after 3 plus years working on HIV issues. She did much to launch the testing and counseling for HIV in Enga Province, wrote and piloted resource materials for schools, and mentored the United to Be group. There’s still much to do . . . . We are looking for long-term volunteers to move forward with this ministry.

Laura and Nathan Hall are in PNG as short term LCMS volunteers. We were excited about the prospect of working together with son Anton, daughter Laura, and son-in-law Nathan, but our unexpected stay in the US means we’re supporting each other long-distance for a spell longer.

While we are away from Papua New Guinea, we ask that you join your prayers with ours: For our co-workers in the Gutnius Lutheran Church. There is a longing for reconciliation and efforts towards that end, but the road is unclear. Pray that the steps taken are Godly ones, taken with love and forgiveness, faith and prayer.

For Steve’s health. We don’t know the course of his brain tumor, but we can pray boldly that God’s will be done. Healing, the grace to live with an uncertain future, patience, and God’s peace . . . they’re all in the prayer mix.

For LCMS World Mission. We pray that financial constraints do not hinder the proclamation of God's Good News. Should God be leading you to support LCMS World Mission endeavors, your gifts can be sent to LCMS World Mission, either to be used as you designate, or to use where they are most needed.

May God grant you His peace when you need to “wait three days and see what God will do.” Be assured He is risen! He is risen indeed!
