LEAP BACK INTO GODSPEAK!



FROM PASTOR SEABAUGH





A STEWARDSHIP MOMENT



I stopped by Starbucks the other day and overheard an interesting conversation. “Your total is \$3.47 today,” I overheard the cashier said to the woman who just pulled up in the Starbucks drive-through. This customer told the cashier she wanted to pay for the beverage of the customer in line behind her. Seems that last week someone had done the same for her and it completely made her day. As the cashier processed both transactions for her I thought, “This really is a great way to make someone’s day.”

As the next car pulled forward, the cashier handed the woman her cappuccino grande and told her it had already been paid for by the customer in front of her in line. These two women had never met but a connection was made by the generosity of the first woman. The second customer was so overjoyed she immediately handed cash to the cashier and told her she wanted to pay for the drink of the person behind her in line. “If I can pass on this feeling that someone gave me, I am going to do it too,” she enthusiastically commented before she drove away.

As the line moved again I thought this was really pretty cool to see people offer such generosity for people they had never met. The next car pulled forward. As the cashier handed the young man his beverage and told him it was covered, he was shocked for a minute. The cashier explained everything that had happened and he said, “I guess it’s my lucky day.” He drove off with the generosity of the two previous customers in his hand without even a glance in his rear view mirror to see who might be awaiting his generosity. Generosity is offered to us but we don’t think about extending that generosity to another because there might not be enough for us later.

Our God is a generous God and provided his dear son Jesus Christ to die on the cross for our sins. Our God is also a generous God when He provides for our daily needs. God provides us with every blessing in abundance, so we may share with others abundantly in every good work and there will still be enough for us later. We are being good stewards of His abundant gifts when we return to God a tithe of the bounteous gifts He has given to us. We are being generous when we share God’s gifts with others, like the ladies at Starbucks did.

Everything belongs to God, and God has been so good to us. We have so much to be thankful for. When we look at the abundance around us, we know that God is a first fruits giver. God has given his first and his best in Jesus Christ. God is a first fruits giver to you. So let’s trust God and give back first fruits to Him as a sign of our love and gratefulness. Let’s take a look at our checkbooks and examine our priorities. Let’s pray about and ask the Spirit to guide us in our spending decisions. Dixie Johnson, Spencer Mast, Emma Hayhurst & Lynne Rustad had a great week (7/31-8/7) at Casa de Niños in Tepic Mexico – an orphanage that provides a Christian home for children whose parents are unable to raise them.



This year our group began our visit by leading the Sunday morning worship - the older kids led three songs, Emma & Spencer read bible stories in Spanish and then we had bible activities for the kids – coloring a picture, a question page on the story and a word search.

We mostly just hung out with the kids. We played futbol (soccer) and volleyball. We brought paint by number projects for the kids which the kids just loved. Dixie was knitting and then the girls wanted to learn. They all started out with pencils. Then some dowels were found and a young boy, Martin, sanded points on them and the girls had wooden needles. We sent Russ, the director out for more yarn and needles and when the girls finished their first project with practice yarn, they received more yarn and real needles. Several girls were on their second project before we left.



The kids were their 6 week summer vacation, when enrichment activities are arranged. This year was music lessons from a Cuban man – one hour of Music theory, one hour of piano and one hour of guitar.



The older kids had English lessons from Joan (a missionary for the casa) and she gave them instructions that they were to speak English to us to practice and become confident. They do have English in school, but are not really willing to use it. It was an interesting week of us speaking Spanish and the kids practicing their English! When we did our bible lessons, the older kids did their bible activities in English.

The kids are from abusive homes, have parents with drug or alcohol problems or their parents are in jail. Some of the kids come from homes where the parents just cannot financially support their children.

Pray that we were effective in showing them God's love!



CENTRAL LUTHERAN SCHOOL CONSTITUTION REVISION



While many Christian schools are closing around the country, Central Lutheran School has been able to stay strong. The support of the association congregations is essential in keeping the school strong for years to come. As the school looks to the future we realize changes need to be made to broaden the outreach of the school and to strengthen the support coming into the school from a number of directions.

As a first step in that process, a revision of the CLS Constitution will come before the association congregations in September. At this time, CLS is seeking feedback on the proposed changes, and later ratification by the four association congregations. Copies of the revised constitution will be made available as well as a FAQ that covers the most important changes. If you have any questions about the changes please contact Pastor Seabaugh, as he serves on the Church Partnership Task force at CLS and has been very involved in the process. Thank you!

Q: Why are we changing our constitution? (FAQ #1 of 9)

A: The “churched” culture which started and supported Lutheran schools for Lutheran students is gradually diminishing. Today our Lutheran schools have nearly as many non-Lutheran students and non-Christian students as Lutheran students while we continue to function under a model which assumes a Lutheran student majority. Our current constitution was written assuming this "churched" culture. The proposed constitutional change represents a philosophy for the next generation of CLS association members, staff, students and their families that integrates outreach into association membership, gives teachers more freedom to choose a church home and builds a structure that is more nimble and responsive to internal and external dynamics.
