US-BASED CITIZEN IDENTIFIES WITH SAPO PARK RESIDENTS (NEWSPAPER ARTICLE)

A Liberian serving in the United States Navy, Benjamin Woto, has identified himself with people of Jalay Town, where he started his first job immediately upon completion of high school as a Research Assistant at the Sapu National Park (SNP) in Sinoe County. Mr. Woto recently made a presentation of clothes, shoes, jerseys and other sporting equipment to the park Headquarters. Presenting the items worth a little over US \$10,000 to the people of Jalay Town, Mr. Woto told the residents that the time has come for them to be remembered. He informed local leaders, elders, women and youth of his wish to return to assist them.

He used the occasion to praise the St Paul Bethel Lutheran Church Pastor, David Seabaugh for approving his proposal for encouraging the church congregation to fully contribute clothes and other items that were donated. The contribution was made by the St Paul Bethel Lutheran Church in Minnesota, in collaboration with LINC TWIN CITIES, Minnesota USA. He declared that the concentration of his organization 'MBRACE' will center on the SNP.

The Technical manager for the Conservation Department, T.V. Freeman, who led a team from the Forestry Development Authority (FDA) commended Woto for the spirit of compassion for conserving the forest resources of Liberia.

"The intent of this gesture is not only to assist the people but equally to create the environment aimed at making known for them to be aware of the importance of the Park and its forest resources." Woto said. He said the gesture was not only done for the community but the entire country, pointing out, these people need to be catered to one way or another, this will encourage them to provide care for protected areas not only at the SNP but around the country where there are protected areas. He disclosed plans to include improving hygiene condition in the area, naming youth recreation and sporting activities as first preference.

The Bethel Lutheran Church Family was praised by Freeman for contributing to the community dwellers, thus making them feel a part of the whole that they can be remembered. Freeman however challenged church and other institutions to emulate the good example of the St Paul Bethel Family.

UNDESERVED: GOD'S GIFT OF GRACE

FROM PASTOR SEABAUGH

We've all met people whose perception of themselves far exceeded their actual ability. If we're honest with ourselves, we find that it's also great description of us! It's true! There's nothing more humbling than being a human being. Think about it. Do we have the ability to create ourselves? No. We are in this world completely apart from our doing. There's air, water, food, shelter, clothes, and more that are simply there. Sure, you can get better shelter and better clothes and better food with some effort, but the fact that they exist is not of our doing. Luther's explanation to the first article of the creed is awesome. After listing all the things God simply provides to his creation, he says "All this He does only out of fatherly, divine goodness and mercy, without any merit or worthiness in me."

That's Grace

Grace is a gift you don't deserve. If you earn it, then it's not grace. For some reason, I think we struggle to realize that our lives are filled to the brim with grace. There are so many basic beautiful things beyond our control that we can easily take for granted. These things are gifts! When we treat these things as gifts it changes our perspective on life. First, it gives us a realistic look at who we are versus who God is. Like I said, we often think quite highly of ourselves! Second, it gives us realistic expectations about what we can and should be doing. The classic example also comes from Luther in his explanation to the third article. "I believe that I cannot by my own reason or strength believe in Jesus Christ, my Lord, or come to Him; but the Holy Spirit has called me by the Gospel, enlightened me with His gifts, sanctified and kept me in the true faith." That's grace.

WaterLife

When our idea of grace is off, so is our Christian witness. That's why I really like our WaterLife concept. WaterLife is all about living our baptism and sharing our stories. Well, baptism is all about God's grace! It's the forgiveness of sins won by Jesus on the cross given through water and God's word. It's dying with him and rising to a new life! It's all grace! We don't deserve that! WaterLife is all about taking the gift of life and forgiveness into our daily lives. Living God's grace means appreciating what he does and calling it that. This is the day the Lord has made. This is the life he has given us. This is our hope for eternity hanging on a cross and tied up with a bow. When we show others how we appreciate God's gift, we truly represent the one who's given it to us.

Undeserved: God's Gift of Grace

This is important. It's of vital importance. It's so important that we're going to try something new with our GodSpeak readings. Rather than take on another book of the Bible, we're going to take on a topic: Grace. We'll look at five different aspects of God's grace over five weeks. Creation, Salvation, Baptism, Communion and New Creation. Six days a week there will be a reading from God's word about grace. These readings will encourage and challenge us. Our worship will reflect these readings on grace. Ultimately, I pray these five weeks will help us wrap our minds and our hearts around the character of our God, and who we should be as his people. What a gift!



VOA - Corrections: A Ministry of Transportation

In Mark 2 we learn of a time when a few men had to find a creative way to get their friend to Jesus.

“A few days later, when Jesus again entered Capernaum, the people heard that he had come home. So many gathered that there was no room left, not even outside the door, and he preached the word to them. Some men came, bringing to him a paralytic, carried by four of them. Since they could not get him to Jesus because of the crowd, they made an opening in the roof above Jesus and, after digging through it, lowered the mat the paralyzed man was lying on. When Jesus saw their faith, he said to the paralytic, “Son, your sins are forgiven.”

Just like the men in this account we are given a ministry of transportation. Our mission is to get people to Jesus, by whatever means necessary. One of the ways we participate in this ministry of transportation is by providing rides to those who need them so that they can come and hear the Good News of God’s grace given to us in Christ.



Recently, Bethel has taken up a transportation ministry to the residents at the VOA - Community Corrections Facility near Dale and Larpenteur. We will be providing rides to those interested on Sunday mornings. The residents there are coming out of federal prison and spend the last 3 to 6 months of their sentence at the VOA transitioning back into society. They attend classes on decision-making and managing emotions and triggers. One of the main goals while they are there is to find a job. Finding a job can help to keep them out of trouble and heading in the right direction.

We think that this is an important ministry opportunity to people who are in transition. These folks are going through a difficult transition from prison back into society. We believe that they need God’s Word and grace as much as we do. Please keep this ministry and the residents of the VOA Facility in your prayers.

Lord, We are all in need of your Word and your Grace. You have given us an open door to minister to the residents at the VOA facility. The Gospels are filled with stories of how you sought out those often overlooked by society and loved them. Please grant us humility and love as we reach out to our neighbors at the VOA. In your name Jesus we pray, Amen.

A STEWARDSHIP MOMENT

The idea of putting the phrase “In God We Trust” on U.S. currency was conceived by Salmon P. Chase, the U.S. Treasury Secretary under President Abraham Lincoln. Chase wrote in an 1861 letter to James Pollock, then Director of the Mint in Philadelphia, "No nation can be strong except in the strength of God, or safe except in His defense. The trust of our people in God should be declared on our national coins." The motto appeared on some coins and currency over the years and on July 11, 1954, the U.S. Congress enacted Public Law 84-140 that required the motto on all coins and currency. In 1956 the U.S. Congress enacted Public Law 84-851 that states: "'In God We Trust' is the national motto."



Look at the phrase “In God We Trust” next time you open your wallet and pull out a piece of currency. What does this phrase mean to you? For me, it means that all that I have (all that is in my wallet and more) comes from God and is a gift from God. I trust that a generous God will provide for my needs so I faithfully return to Him a portion of what He has given to me.

Some people have said that one's giving can be a thermometer of faith, meaning that if giving is cold and ungenerous, that probably reflects a cold faith. On the other hand, if one's giving is more generous, it probably reflects a much warmer faith. While this is true, giving can also be a thermostat. Would you like to grow in faith and to trust God more? If you would, then increase your giving, raise the thermostat and your faith will warm. If you give more, you will need to trust God more. This thermostat image fits with Jesus' teaching that where your treasure is, there your heart will be also (Matthew 6:21). For Jesus there is a clear connection between money and faith: you can't buy your relationship with God but your relationship with God will affect your economic decisions and your economic decisions will affect your relationship with God.

"It is better to trust the LORD than to put confidence in man" (Psalm 118:8).


