

An Ordination-Inspired Reflection FROM PASTOR SEABAUGH

I am suddenly struck with the reality that I've been mentoring Lusienie Fofana for over half a decade. It's been over 6 years since that day when my eyes were opened to the potential that existed in our enthusiastic evangelist from Liberia, West Africa. First we just got together to talk Jesus. Then the conversation intensified when Fofana decided to pursue ordination. We needed to get prerequisite tests passed in Old Testament, New Testament and Christian Doctrine. With those complete, we entered the ordination program; 4 years at 4 classes per year. It was hard. We learned a lot. Here are a few of the lessons we learned.

Some comfort zones are made to be broken.

My upbringing was in small farming communities around the Midwest. 6 years ago I could count the African people of my acquaintance on one hand. In our early meetings, I was lucky to understand 2 words of every 5 out of Fofana's mouth. While I grew up next to a cornfield, this man was living the horrors of war every day. I wasn't trained nor prepared to mentor an African immigrant refugee in pastoral ministry! Not even close. But everything about the man across the table screamed to me that he could shepherd God's flock. I knew if I was willing to listen, adapt, and be patient, we could do it together. By God's grace, we did.

People grow slowly.

Think of it. It took 15-18 years for you to grow to your current height. For years you grew by tiny amounts each day. Throw in a growth spurt here and there and you've got it! The same goes for us in our growth as followers of Jesus. I admit, there were days when I expected too much of Fofana and I felt frustrated when he didn't deliver. There were also days when I expected too little and he blew me out of the water! One sermon at a time, one discussion at a time, one lesson at a time, one paper at a time God was shaping His servant. Make that... servants. Slowly I grew too.

Failure is an option.

It's very tempting to teach in a way that seeks to prevent the student from experiencing as much failure as possible. Every effort would be made to ensure that every paper, test or project is supervised with assistance every step of the way. Here's reality. I fail every day and I knew Fofana needed to learn how to fail without calling it quits. The only way you learn how to cope with failure is to have the freedom to fail and loving Christian brothers and sisters to encourage you through it. So, I chose not to pre-check Fofana's coursework. Sometimes he failed. I didn't pre-check Fofana's sermons. Some left a lot to be desired. I didn't insist on how the ministry was to be run. Some initiatives fell flat. The result was that many of Fofana's failures led to breakthroughs that wouldn't have happened otherwise. Even yet, I give Fofana tremendous credit that he saw every failure as an opportunity to grow and learn. By God's grace, that's exactly what happened.

It's not about me.

It's one thing to know it's not about me. It's quite another thing to keep it that way week in and week out over an extended period of time. At every turn there is the temptation to be selfish. This is one of many areas where Fofana made me a better mentor. He always says, "By the grace of God" even if we're just scheduling a meeting later that day! Grace. God's gift to undeserving us. Fofana wasn't doing this for himself. He was doing it for the people lost without Jesus. He was doing it because of God's grace to him that he could extend out to others. Well, if Fofana could sacrifice so much and work so hard for the sake of others, I could give it my all too... by the grace of God.

I rejoice that on November 18th we will, by the grace of God, call Lusienie Fofana our pastor.

Who is my Neighbor? - Luke 10

Lately I've been reading a book entitled Greek for the Rest of Us. It's a book that teaches a person to utilize the vast amounts of Greek bible study tools without actually learning to translate Greek. In the opening chapters of the book, the author explains why we have different translations and the pros and cons of each. At one point he tells a story of when the English Standard Version translation committee came to Luke 10 to translate it. The author says that many Americans will read "neighbor" and think of those who live on either side of their house, not any "fellow human being". He ended up losing the vote and the ESV translated it "neighbor" because the verse was too well known to change.



The reason I share this story is that this highlights a common misunderstanding within Christianity. When Jesus calls us to love our neighbor he isn't simply saying to love those who live next door (although this is part of it). He isn't calling us to love those we like or know (although this too is part of it). Jesus is calling us to be our brother or sister's keeper. He shares the story of the Good Samaritan to show us that our neighbor may be someone that we aren't expecting.

The Good Samaritan helped his neighbor at his own expense and "got his hands dirty". We live in a hurting world. One of the ways that God blesses the world is through His People loving their neighbors. We are part of God's "relief plan" for the world.

Dear Lord, give us eyes to see who in our lives need your love and our care. Help us to use the resources that you've given us to change lives and love others as you've loved us and changed our life. Amen.

A Stewardship Moment



As Christians we rejoice that our nation observes a national day of thanksgiving. Thanksgiving Day provides us with the opportunity to express our thankfulness to God for all His blessings, and then continue to express our thankfulness on an ongoing basis. Christian stewards are people with grateful hearts and giving hands. All good gifts come from God and He intends for us to receive them with thankfulness and use them in ways that honor Him and bless others.

You are called to be God's steward. This is the theme for our Fall Stewardship drive. Our goal this year is to remind our parishioners that our God is a God of abundance and to acknowledge our call as God's steward. The annual stewardship drive is not something we do each fall in order to balance the congregation's budget. Rather, a stewardship campaign is an opportunity to help people grow as disciples of Jesus. The Bible says that everything belongs to God, who created the earth and all that is in it. The Bible also tells us that God has entrusted us to care for and manage all that is God's - to be faithful stewards.

Being a Christian steward is not a once in a lifetime experience. It is a process that continues day after day. It is a process in which we live out what we have been called to be—namely, the children of God. Just as children resemble and imitate their parents, so also we Christian stewards imitate our Heavenly Father. God's stewardship is shown in loving and giving—loving the world so much that he gave his only-begotten Son (John 3:16).

Please bring or send your pledge envelope to the church office at your earliest convenience if you are unable to attend Commitment Sunday services. 

Ethel Agnew's Swedish Spritz Cookies

Mix 1 cup (2 sticks) butter (no substitutes) & 1 cup sugar together until very creamy and smooth

Add:

3 TBSP heavy whipping cream

1 egg yolk

1 tsp almond extract

1 1/2 cups flour

Put dough in cookie press and shape into circles or other shapes. DO NOT chill dough. Bake at 375° for 4-4 1/2 minutes.

Carolyn Weber's Rice Krispie Drop Cookies

1 cup white sugar

1 cup brown sugar

1 cup oil

1 cup margarine

1 egg

1 tsp vanilla

1 tsp cream of tartar

1 tsp soda

3 1/2 cups flour

2 cups Rice Krispys

Mix together and drop by spoon onto baking sheet. Press down with fork and bake at 350° for 8-9 minutes.
