

Only a few spots are left on the bus so sign up to be part of Bethel's Urban Plunge on Saturday, February 9. The day will include a stop at the Union Gospel Mission (a Christian ministry dedicated to serving the homeless, poor, and addicted in our community), the VOA - Residential Re-Entry Facility (Volunteers of America has championed the humane treatment of prisoners and provided services to help offenders successfully transition from prison to productive life in the community) and a City Vision Bus Tour of a nearby neighborhood in St Paul!

Joining the Family Business

FROM PASTOR SEABAUGH

Have you ever wondered what the big deal is about the name of God? It's everywhere, but what does it mean? At the beginning of our worship we invoke the name of the Triune God. We baptize in the Triune name of God. Christians bear the name of God and praise the name of God. The Lord's Prayer says that Our Father's name is hallowed, which means "holy" or "set apart". But isn't it just a name, like mine? David. You say, "David" I say, "What?" We converse. Is the name of God just a label or is there more to it than that? You guessed it. There's a lot more, and it has everything to do with the family business.

The Family Business

It used to be more common, but we still have a few family businesses out there. You can usually spot them because the family's last name is also a big part of the name of the business. People associate that name not only with the family, but also the business. These businesses get passed from generation to generation and are often really good at what they do. That's because there's a very natural apprenticeship that happens for the next generation. From birth a child knows that they one day will inherit the family business. So, they grow up working in the business. They learn the tricks of the trade from an early age and carry that excellence into their ownership of the business, eventually handing off the family business to the next generation. On and on...

The Name of God

Think of the name of God as the name of God's family business. At our baptism we are adopted into this Father, Son and Holy Spirit family, so now we bear the same name as the family. Not only that, but we are promised to inherit the family business. What kind of business is this? What's the Triune God's business plan? How about, "to seek and to save what was lost." (*Luke 19:10*) Or, "For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life." (*John 3:16*) A famous theologian, N.T. Wright, summarizes the family business rather succinctly, "putting the world back to rights." Jesus does that for us on the cross and an empty tomb. He gives us the gift of forgiveness through faith. So what's our role in the family business?

His Business is Our Business

Just like any family business, we learn the business, carry out the business and pass the business on to the next generation. Why? Because in your baptism you became a part of this family. God's name is your name. God's business is your business. "Jesus said, "Peace be with you! As the Father has sent me, I am sending you." (*John 20:21*) "I tell you the truth, anyone who has faith in me will do what I have been doing." (*John 14:12*) The name of God is both identity and mission. We are the children of God! Every one of us who bears the name of God has an integral role in the family business! We carry the truth of Jesus' into the world. We communicate through our words and our actions that forgiveness of sins has been earned for them by the blood of Jesus. We run the family business as well as we are able knowing our success depends on the work of the Holy Spirit. By God's grace more come to be baptized and are adopted into the family and bear the Triune name of God. Then when it's time to join Him forever, we pass the business on to the next generation. God's family business goes on. In the name of the Father, and of the † Son and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.



Hebrews 4:12





Sold Out for the Kingdom of God - Matthew 13

Two of my favorite parables recorded in the Bible are the parable "A Treasure Hidden in a Field" and "The Pearl of Great Price". They are the shortest parables we have and contain a simple message. In each parable, someone finds something of great value. They go away and sell everything they have to obtain it.

Now, Jesus is not telling us that if we get enough money together that we can buy our way into the kingdom. The message of these parables is that when we are shown the Kingdom of God (which is of great value), we've experienced truth and everything else is worthless in comparison. The kingdom is so valuable, so important, so beautiful that we live for it rather than everything else in our life.

All too often we let the things of this world distract us from the kingdom of God. We let financial concerns, busyness and sin get in the way of how Christ called us to live.



What does it look like to sell out for the kingdom? Live. Live for God not yourself. Use the gifts you've been blessed with. Your home, your car, your money to love others and introduce them to Jesus. Paul said it well when he wrote to the churches in Ephesus, Be very careful, then, how you live—not as unwise but as wise, making the most of every opportunity, because the days are evil.

In short, we sell out for the kingdom. Our time, energy and resources go to living out the love and truth of Christ in the context that God has placed us in.

A Stewardship Moment



The Epiphany season began on January 6th with the visit of the Wise Men to worship the Baby Jesus as the newborn King of the Jews and continues until Ash Wednesday. Epiphany is a word that means "showing forth" or "manifesting." Jesus teaches that we are lights in this spiritually dark world who give evidence of our new birth as Christians as we love even our enemies and seek first the Kingdom of God and His righteousness. To live that way is truly an "epiphany experience" to show that we really belong to our Lord Jesus Christ and by the power of the Holy Spirit live renewed lives.

That's what Christian stewardship is all about! Wise Christian stewards manage all of life and life's resources for God's purposes and do it freely and joyfully! We practice the kind of stewardship that is pleasing to our Lord when we give freely and generously of our time to serve in special ways that bless the mission of the church and the people living in our communities. This kind of stewardship is also shown when we freely and joyfully offer our talents and skills to enlarge and encourage the Kingdom of God, and continues when we give freely and joyfully of our financial resources to support the work as well.

Just as Jesus came on that first Christmas to bring light to a darkened world, so we are called to follow His example. Will we follow in His footsteps perfectly? Will we use all that we are and have in truly unselfish ways? No, of course not! We are sinners and will fall short of the glory of God. But, in Christ, God has declared us to be saints because our sins and shortcomings have been forgiven and the Holy Spirit empowers us to let our lights shine so that people will see our good deeds and praise our Father in heaven.

The bottom line for Christian stewards is to hear and obey our Lord's words when he taught: "Seek first the kingdom of God and His righteousness, and all these things (material blessings) will be given to you as well. Therefore do not worry about tomorrow, for tomorrow will worry about itself" (Matthew 6:33-34 NIV).




BIBLE BOWL 2013 — MARCH 16, 2013

Italian Beef & Potato Casserole from Betty Paulus

- | | |
|---|-------------------------------------|
| 1 lb lean ground beef | 1 (5 1/2 oz) pkg scalloped potatoes |
| 1 (16 oz) can tomatoes | 1 (10 1/2 oz) can pizza sauce |
| 1/2 cup water | 1/2 tsp salt |
| 1/2 tsp oregano leaves | 1/4 tsp basil leaves |
| 1/8 tsp garlic powder | |
| 1 cup mozzarella cheese, cut into small cubes | |
| 1/4 cup grated Parmesan cheese | |

Brown meat until crumbly, then drain off fat. In slow cooking pot, combine beef with dry sauce mix from package of scalloped potatoes, tomatoes, pizza sauce, water, salt, oregano, basil and garlic powder. Stir in dry potato slices. Cover and cook on low 4-5 hours. Turn control to high and stir in cubes of mozzarella cheese. Top with parmesan cheese. Cover and cook on high for 10-15 minutes. Makes 4-6 servings.

Pulled Turkey from Suzie Norris

Put one fresh or frozen turkey breast in crockpot. Sprinkle with one packet of Original Ranch Dressing. Put one stick of butter on top. Cover and cook on low for 6-7 hours. When skin and bones can be removed easily and meat shredded it is done.

Serve on Buns.


