

## Recovery Fellowship at Bethel Lutheran Church

We all know people who struggle with persistent hurts, hang-ups, bad habits and dependencies. Often that person stares us back in the mirror. Bethel's Recovery Fellowship ministry is designed to help people overcome these difficulties using a biblical approach. The Celebrate Recovery curriculum used is a Christ-centered 12-step program incorporating 8 principles drawn from the Beatitudes. This ministry is open to anyone desiring freedom from issues that can rob the serenity and joy in our lives. These issues include but are not limited to: anger, depression, control, compulsive behaviors, codependency, and addictions. Recovery Fellowship sessions will be held in the fellowship hall every Saturday at 3:00 pm., starting January 11, 2014. If you or a friend or relative struggle in these ways, please come. Everything said at a ministry session is confidential. Names of participants are never released outside of the group and only within the group with your permission. ## "Jesus' Baptism IS our Baptism"

In Jesus' great commission, he tells his disciples to be "teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you" (Mat. 28:20). So, over the last year, we have paid close attention to Jesus' commands in Matthew so that we can be disciples who make disciples. It's amazing how Jesus teaches us everything we need to know about being in His Kingdom. But what about the other part of Jesus' commission? What about baptism? Jesus tells us to baptize in the Triune name of God. But where does Jesus teach on baptism? He doesn't. Nowhere in Matthew does Jesus sit the disciples down to teach them the meaning of Baptism. So, how can Jesus command us to do something he hasn't taught us about?

The only place we see Jesus connected with baptism is his own baptism. Since many early Christians only had this one Gospel, we have to assume the meaning of baptism must be in Jesus baptism... somewhere. Jackpot. Not only does Jesus teach us by example what our baptism is, but he sets the foundation for the entire Kingdom of God there in that one watery moment. Let's take a look at it.

*And when Jesus was baptized, immediately he went up from the water, and behold, the heavens were opened to him, and he saw the Spirit of God descending like a dove and coming to rest on him; and behold, a voice from heaven said, " This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased."*

*Matthew 3:16-17 (ESV)*

### **Who We Become in Baptism**

Three things happen to Jesus that he doesn't really need. Jesus doesn't need the Spirit. He was conceived by the Spirit. He doesn't need to know he's the Son. He's always been the Son. Since Jesus is perfect, he's already pleasing the Father too. So why does Jesus do it? Jesus tells us to follow him, right? He's leading the way for us. We follow Him right into the water where God does three amazing things to us. 1) God gives us his Holy Spirit like a dove. We are set apart from the rest of the world because we are a part of His Peaceful Kingdom. 2) We become the beloved children of God. We can call the Creator "Father" because he has adopted us as his children. 3) The Father is pleased with us because our sins have been washed away by the blood of Jesus. That's the only way sinners like us could receive the Father's approval! So, who we become in baptism is right there. We receive the Holy Spirit, adoption as God's children and forgiveness through Jesus. Simple as that... but there's more.

### **In the Name of...**

Jesus tells us to baptize *in the name* of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. To speak or act in the name of someone else is to act with their authority and according to their purpose and mission. It's more than just identity. So, could we also see our Christian lives through our baptism? Bigger Jackpot. The three things we receive in baptism are the three persons of the Trinity, a new life where we seek to live the purpose and mission of the Triune God.

### **Holy Spirit**

In baptism we receive the Holy Spirit like a dove. But how do we live *in the name* of the Holy Spirit? Jesus teaches us that. It means being poor in spirit, humble, realizing that our sinful spirit needs to be replaced with God's Holy Spirit. It means having a new heart that treasures the things of God above all else and bearing that kind of fruit. It means loving the perfect peace of God's original creation and bringing that peace into our world, even if our lives are threatened for the sake of others. God gives us His Spirit so we can live *in the name* of the Spirit.

### **Father**

In baptism we are adopted as the Father's beloved children. But how do we live *in the name* of the Father? Jesus teaches us that. It means we depend on our Father for everything, much like a small child depends on parents for everything. Since everything we have really belongs to Daddy, we learn to be content with His provision and avoid seeking after the false gods of power, prestige and possessions. It means we have a new family, because all who have been baptized and follow Jesus are fellow sons and daughters of our Father in heaven. And since our Daddy is so big and powerful, we don't pretend to judge people or feel the need to retaliate when people insult us. We can let Daddy take care of that. Our job is love them the way Daddy loves us. Being a child of God means living *in the name* of the Father.

### **Son**

The only way we can be pleasing to the Father is if our sins have been forgiven by the blood of Jesus, His Son. But how do we live *in the name* of the Son? Jesus teaches us that. We forgive others as we have been forgiven. Jesus has bridged the chasm between us and God! That's great for us, but what about the rest of humanity? We have a new Spirit in us and a Father who takes care of us. So we risk reputation and self for the sake of even our worst enemies so that they can see their sin, repent and receive forgiveness from us and forgiveness from God. That's love. We follow Jesus. We seek the life He lived. When we fail, we humbly repent, receive his forgiveness and keep following. We look forward to a day when Jesus will come back and the chasm of sin and death will be no more. In the meantime, we watch, we wait, and we witness. Being restored in the eyes of God means living *in the name* of the Son.

In the end it's so simple. Jesus' baptism IS our baptism. When we follow Him into the water we are given our identity and our mission, in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

## My Grace is Sufficient for You!

The prayer of Jesus in the Garden of Gethsemane is perhaps the greatest. It is a very moving prayer.

Our Lord Jesus Christ asked His Father in Heaven that the cup of crucifixion which was about to be pushed on Him might be taken away.


But then in His next prayer He said "nevertheless, not my will, but your will." This is a prayer of strength and power.

He may not make your problems go away, but He will give you the power to deal with them and to overcome them by His Grace. Amen




## From Jordan Ray, Director of Christian Outreach

### Me, My New Self and I - Colossians 3

Have you ever set a New Year's resolution? Have you set a goal to be a better version of yourself? Maybe you've decided to quit smoking, give up cheeseburgers or even read your Bible everyday. The truth is we all desire to do better, to be better. So how well have your resolutions gone in the past? How long did your resolve to be a better self last?

When we resolve to fix ourselves we expose another reality: We fall short. The scriptures tell us that "all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God". We lack the ability to make ourselves new. We cannot simply will ourselves to be new, to be recreated. It is God who did the creating in the first place and we must look to Him for our new selves.

Paul tells the church in Colossae about their new selves. He says "since you have taken off your old self with its practices and have put on the new self, which is being renewed in knowledge in the image of its Creator". It is in Christ that we have put on the new self our soul longs for. We have been made new! We no longer walk in the ways of our old self following the passions and desires of this world. No, we look forward to the next one.



Living as new selves in a broken world is part of the mission God gave us when we were called. God has sent us as His ambassadors of reconciliation. We live our lives humbly, gently and simply. We live lives that help to restore the lives of others. When a neighbor is going through difficult times, we are there to help. When someone falls into an addiction, we are there to show them the way out. When the devil comes in and has someone doubting God's truth, we come along side them and share the Good News with them again. We've been made new and we share that exciting opportunity with others so they can experience the newness of God with us!



## A Stewardship Moment



Over the last several years, we've had countless opportunities to ask people, "Why do you give?" We haven't done any scientific research around the answers, but we're convinced the greatest predictor of generosity is how people answer this question. When people say something like, "I give because God has been so generous to me," we've found that person to most often be quite generous in their giving.

When people say something like, "I give because the church has been there for me and my family and I would feel bad if I didn't give back," we've found that person to most often be much less generous.

Heartfelt, sincere generosity often characterizes giving grounded in God's generosity. Giving grounded in what the church has provided or is providing often feels a bit transactional. One person gives freely. The other person gives what is needed to complete the transaction.

Do we really understand that God is the owner of all that is, and that God has entrusted some of His possessions into our care? Do we see ourselves as a part of God's holy history of providing for us through the centuries? This might be a great occasion to read the Bible and learn about God's ownership and God's holy history of providing. It might also be a great time to tie our thankful giving not to what the church has provided, but to what God has provided. What type of giver are you?




## "55" CLUB FELLOWSHIP—THURSDAY, JANUARY 9


